**SB 2022** – The Employee Contribution Bill for FRS Senate Vote on March 31, 2010

Two votes took place – **Senator Lawson** filed an amendment stripping the employee contribution requirement out of the bill. The amendment failed. A few Senators are shown as voting two times on the amendment. Often a Senator makes a vote on something by mistake and changes his or her vote after Roll Call.
